It is important to discuss any medications or substances that you may be taking, including over the counter medications, recreational drugs, alcohol, or any herbal medications, along with informing the doctor of your complete health status. A physical exam is recommended every year.

All aspects of treatment are held in strict confidentiality, and written consent is required for any aspect of your treatment to be communicated to another party. However, in cases of the possibility of significant dangerousness to yourself or others, the rule of confidentiality may be superseded. The law requires all cases of suspected child abuse/neglect be reported to the authorities.

Your treatment may involve telehealth sessions. Telehealth is the delivery of healthcare services through interactive technologies where the patient and clinician are not in the same room. Such treatment increases convenience and accessibility to treatment and reduces the possibility of patient and clinician exposure to infectious disease. However, a lack of access to the information that might be available in a face to face visit but not a teletherapy visit may adversely affect clinical decision making. There is a risk of deficiencies, delays or failures during the transfer of services due to electronic circumstances, and telehealth is not sufficient to provide emergency clinical care.

If hospitalization is required, your inpatient care will be referred to another psychiatrist. A referral may also be necessary in cases of significant alcohol or drug abuse, or other complex situation. In case of the need for a referral, efforts will be made in assisting you to find an appropriate mental healthcare provider.

Unless prior arrangements have been made, you are responsible for filing your own insurance. Because of the importance of the doctor-patient relationship, regularly scheduled appointments are required in order for Dr. Wyant to prescribe medication. Five business days should be allowed for medication refill requests.

Except for special circumstances, 24 hour notice is required to avoid being charged for a missed appointment.

If you need to contact the office for non-emergency purposes, call 817-410-2600. For urgent matters, call me at 817-980-1991. Please call 911 in case of emergency. Please do not use e mail or text for scheduling, prescription refills, or any urgent form of communication. Regularly scheduled appointments are required in order for Dr. Wyant to prescribe medication, and five business days should be allowed for medication refill requests. Controlled substances will only be refilled during regular office hours.

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
